<u>ENGLISH</u>



During the term all students will participate in activities that will develop their oral language, reading and writing skills through modelled, shared, guided and individual processes. Students will be involved in a range of engaging reading tasks and have access to a variety of texts. Daily reading will continue through regular practice with their fluency partner.

The children will also have the opportunity to write in a variety of different genres depending on the purpose and audience. These will include writing to entertain (narratives), persuade, inform, explain and instruct. Early in the term our focus will also be on writing and delivering speeches.

There is also a strong focus on the teaching of handwriting, word study, punctuation and grammar.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Our topic for this term is **How can we come to know God** in our lives?

Questions we will explore will include:

- What does God mean to you?
- How do we come to know God?
- How is God revealed to us?
- What does the Church teach us about God?



Content Focus: Students explore places across a range of scales within Australia and Australia's location in the world. They describe connections people, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples, have with places, both locally and globally. Students identify factors affecting people's accessibility to places.

MATHEMATICS

For Mathematics the children will be working in the strands of *Number & Algebra, Measurement & Geometry and Statistics and Probability.*

Number

Multiplication/Division, Addition/Subtraction, Patterns and Algebra

Measurement Mass, Position, Volume

Statistics and Probability Chance and Data

Problem Solving

Home practice with speed and accuracy is to be encouraged through learning times tables, patterns and number sense. Everyday Maths at home with cooking, measuring and estimating is also very supportive.

Study Ladder activities will reinforce the children's learning as well.

<u>JAPANESE</u>



Students will develop a deeper understanding and appreciation for the Japanese celebration 'Tanabata'. They will explore the unique traditions associated with this celebration, while identifying similarities and differences to their own culture. Students will revise Japanese colour vocabulary matching these words with their corresponding hiragana, katakana and kanji scripts.

SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY

The Digital Technologies strand will focus on digital systems and how they transmit data. Students explore different types of data, have the opportunity to learn how to interpret patterns and develop skills in visual programming and coding. We will be using "Scratch" and "Code.org."

Visual Arts

This term we will develop the student's artistic skill set focusing on line, texture and colour. Students will be asked to experiment with a variety of mediums and artistic techniques to create imaginative artworks based on realistic settings and concepts. This will reflect both representations of mythical creatures from the past and present.

Dance/Music

This term in Music the focus will be creative dance. It will explore creativity through dance, expression and movement.

PD/H/PE

Our PDH Unit this term is **Me and My Mates.** This deals with roles, rights and responsibilities in relationships with a focus on emotional and social wellbeing.
