RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

During this term students will look at various parables to help us think about the mercy and love of God.

We will begin looking at Baptism: the sacrament by which a person is welcomed as a member of the Church community and shares in Jesus' life and mission.

The children will also be a part of special liturgies this term such as:

The Ascension: In the scripture story Ascension is the time when Jesus returned to his Father. The scripture tells us this happened 40 days after we celebrate the resurrection.

Pentecost: The Church celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.



ENGLISH

Students are involved in daily literacy activities that include:

- Oral language and communication
- Vocabulary
- Phonological awareness
- Phonic knowledge
- Reading fluency
- Reading comprehension
- Creating written texts
- Spelling
- Handwriting
- Understanding and responding to literature



Reading:

Students will be participating in shared, modelled, guided and independent reading. We especially focus on building fluency, pausing to enhance meaning, responding to punctuation and using expression.

Writing:

A continued focus on a variety of texts exploring the conventions of language in context (grammar, punctuation and spelling).

- Focus on revising, editing and proofreading.
- Using correct letter formation, size and neatness.
- Using a variety of spelling strategies and expanding vocabulary.

We encourage you to read with your children daily, ask questions and make reading time an enjoyable time. Just 15 minutes a day can make all the difference!

CREATIVE ARTS

Visual Arts

Students will explore, observe, investigate, imagine and experiment in their own art making. They will respond to the artworks of other artists who have explored similar subject matter.

MATHEMATICS

Students will be working on the following units from component B of the Stage 1 syllabus:

- Equal means equivalent
- Data helps describe and wonder about the world
- What needs to be measured determines the unit of measurement
- Collections of objects can be changed by adding more (combining) or taking some away (separating)
- Sometimes things move and change location

Students will be working mathematically to develop fluency, reasoning and problem solving.

HISTORY

Places and Special Places

We will be continuing with our unit of study, The Past and the Present.

This topic provides a study of past and present life within the context of the students' own world. Students learn about similarities and differences in family life by comparing the present with the past. This topic also provides study of the local area and significant sites, and how they have changed over time.

SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY

Living Things Habitats

The Living World strand focuses on the features of living things, their environment and how they change and grow. Students research animal habitats and identify that living things live in different places that suit their needs.

SCIENCE

Students will have the opportunity to explore and answer questions through participation in guided scientific investigations, collect data from observations, and record observations using drawings, labelling and digital technologies.

MUSIC

In 2P our Music lessons are all about rhythm patterns and composition. The children will begin to learn the recorder. In 2D and 2S the children will continue to learn the recorder. They will also compose and play a 4 bar, 4 beat recorder piece using the notes G, A and B.

JAPANESE

Students will focus on learning simple language associated with a shopping experience at a fruit shop. Through shared text, they will learn the Japanese fruit vocabulary and role-play requesting and receiving these items. Students will learn how to match these fruits with their corresponding hiragana and katakana words, and explore strategies such as pictures, songs, games and flashcards to master the language.

LIBRARY

The focus remains on developing the students' love of reading. We are encouraging students to read a variety of books including picture books to expand their visual literacy. OLSS reading challenges are a fun way to encourage the students with their reading.

This term the students will learn about author Gregg Driese and share his stories. The students will look at what research is and how we can use research to answer some questions we might have about a topic.

PDH/PE

Moving to Stay Healthy

Students will explore the physical, social and emotional benefits of participating in physical activities. They will investigate and identify actions, contextual factors and behaviours which influence their and others health, safety, wellbeing and participation in physical activity.

PΕ

The children will be participating in various skills and games to help prepare for the Athletics Carnival in Week 4. The children will be developing their fundamental movement skills such as walking, side sliding, running, jumping/landing, and hopping/skipping.

Communication
