RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

One in God's Creation

In this unit students will learn about the creative act of God, an outpouring of divine love and goodness, in which we are all called to share because each individual person is created and loved by God. The students are encouraged to explore their own giftedness and identify how they can use their gifts for the good of all. The students will explore ways they can give glory, praise and thanks to God through prayer and the celebration of the Eucharist. The unit finally focuses on sharing God's love, through the ways we live in right relationship with God and other people, using Jesus as our example.

ENGLISH

The beginning of the Term will focus on our whole school Spelling
Bee Competition. We encourage your children to look at our words
during the holidays and begin to use strategies to help them learn this
bank of words. We will be engaging in activities and games to
consolidate theses skills. More information will come home about this
during Week 10 and Week 1 of next term.

During the term all students will participate in activities that will develop their reading and writing skills through modelled, shared, guided and individual processes. We will use texts to model and support our reading and writing skills. Our focus texts will be Piano Fingers, The Desert (which focuses on Lake Eyre) and a focus on Christmas texts in the last part of the term. Digital texts in EPIC and Literacy Pro will be used as other sources for reading.

The children will have the opportunity to write in a variety of different genres depending on the purpose and audience. Students will be supported through guided writing sessions to help create imaginative and informative texts, based on text types. There is also a strong focus on the teaching of handwriting, spelling, punctuation and grammar. A group of children may even achieve their cursive script licences before entering Year 4. The Soundwaves program and activity book will support our spelling activities.

MATHEMATICS

In Term 3, the focus for Mathematics will be in the following areas:

Additive Relations: Addition and Subtractions problems can be solved by using a variety of strategies.

2D Spatial Measure: Understanding relationships between the properties of 2D shapes helps visualise and organise spaces in the world.

Partitioned Fractions: Model and represent unit fractions and their multiples on a number line to complete a whole. Create fractional parts of a length including, halves, thirds, quarters, fifths and tenths.

Non-Spatial Measurement: Mass What needs to be measured determines the unit of measurement.

Data: Questions can be asked and answered by collecting and interpreting data.

Weekly Times Table Challenge: Targeted practice in times tables where students are challenged to improve speed and accuracy in their mathematical fluency.

Friday Maths Explorer Groups: Each Friday, students will engage in maths lessons tailored to their individual learning needs. The lesson focus and instruction is targeted to specific areas for development, where students will be split across the grade.

GEOGRAPHY

Places are Similar and Different

Students examine the diverse characteristics of Australia's neighbouring countries. They explore the different climates, settlement patterns and demographic characteristics of places, particularly Japan, New Zealand, Vanuatu and Fiji. They will use this information to imagine what it would be like to live in different places. Students consider how people's perceptions of places are the basis for actions to protect places and environments.

SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY



Digital Technologies

The Digital Technologies strand focuses on digital systems and how they transmit data. Students explore different types of data and will have the opportunity to learn how to interpret patterns and develop skills in visual programming. This will involve coding opportunities, particularly with Lego Spike.

CREATIVE ARTS

Visual Arts

In Visual Arts this term the children will be developing knowledge, understanding, skills, values and attitudes in making and appreciating other artists and artworks related to the Japanese, Maori and Islander cultures. The end of the Term will feature Christmas craft and decorations.

MUSIC

This term in Music the children will be revising the instruments of the orchestra and their instrument families. The children will be introduced to 'The Nutcracker' by Tchaikovsky. We will cover the musical elements of pitch and tone colour. We will continue playing the recorder.

LIBRARY

The Focus remains on developing the student's love of reading. We are encouraging students to read a variety of books including picture books to expand their visual literacy. OLSS reading challenges are a fun way to encourage the students with their reading.

The students will look at Cyber safety focusing on the topic: Online boundaries and consent revising Private and personal information.

JAPANESE

Students will begin the unit of work on school life. They will explore cultural differences and similarities to schooling in Australia and Japan, developing an appreciation and respect for other cultures while broadening their perspective and connecting with others. Students will learn the vocabulary for various school items and respond politely to these requests. They will continue to explore strategies to master language acquisition such as flashcards, songs and games. Learn about the differences in Japanese Christmas traditions compared to Australia.

PDH/PE

PE (Enjoying the Game)

This term we aim to develop and improve Fundamental Movement Skills (FMS) through games of t-ball, cricket and oz-tag.

PD

The children will be engaged in Peer Support groups during Term 4 which will be conducted by Year 6.

Our class-based unit will look at how we can maintain a healthy body and brain.
